I will be taking two weeks Annual Leave from April 8 - 21, visiting Chris' family in New Zealand. Then, from June 17 until the end of July, I will take six weeks Long Service Leave. Revd Sue Lodge-Calvert has graciously agreed to cover for me while I am away. Hopefully these two lots of leave will help give me some more energy to see out the year.

As I am sending this out on St Patrick's Day, I would like to end with a lovely Irish Blessing:
