

Dear Parishioners,

I thought it was about time that I wrote to you all again, as there are a few exciting things coming up in the near future which it would be good for you to be aware of.

Bishop Ian Coutt's visit August 1st.



As you can see, Bishop Ian will be visiting St George's in Walpole for the 10 am service on Sunday, August 1. It was decided at the recent Parish Council meeting to close St Leonard's in Denmark for the day and travel over to join with the Walpole congregation and make this a whole parish celebration. There is a list at the back of the church at St Leonard's if you would like a lift that day, otherwise, please contact either me or one of the Wardens. There will be morning tea following the service if you would like to contribute a plate of goodies. There will also be a display of photographs etc from the Walpole Nornalup and District Historical Society.

The mid-week Eucharist continues each first Thursday of the month at 2 pm, our next service will be on August 5.

With the seeming relaxation of COVID rules and regulations, we have had requests for St Leonard's to be open during the week again. Parish Council considered this and looked into the current legislation in regard to our liabilities and obligations in opening a building to the public. As the legislations is rather ambiguous, we sort further advice from the Archdeacon. While we display the required COVID QR code, manual register and our current COVID Safety Plan, we are unable to have someone in attendance while the church is open. The conclusion which came back from the Government COVID Hotline was that:

while churches continue to have the requirement to keep a list of visitors via QR code or paper register, the church is responsible for ensuring that list is both correct and kept safe from those who would use the information on the paper register for any purpose other than to comply with COVID regulations.

Therefore, if the church is responsible, then it is also liable if people do not check in or if their details are misused. In conclusion, the advice is to only have the church open when there is someone there to make sure people are compliant with the mandatory COVID register check in.

So, unfortunately, as we do not have the volunteers to sit all day in the church, St Leonard's will remain closed unless there is a service.

Unfortunately, with COVID still causing a problem around the world, and more alarmingly in the Eastern States, another issue close to many of our hearts is that it looks like being some time yet before we are able to again share in the Common Cup at the Eucharist.

## On to more cheerful matters!
