## Daniel 12.1-3

'At that time Michael, the great prince, the protector of your people, shall arise. There shall be a time of anguish, such as has never occurred since nations first came into existence. But at that time your people shall be delivered, everyone who is found written in the book. Many of those who sleep in the dust of the earth shall awake, some to everlasting life, and some to shame and everlasting contempt. Those who are wise shall shine like the brightness of the sky, and those who lead many to righteousness, like the stars for ever and ever.

## Psalms 16

<sup>1</sup> Preserve me, O God:

**for in you have I taken refuge.**

<sup>2</sup> I have said to the Lord, You are my lord:

**and all my good depends on you.**

<sup>3</sup> As for those who are held holy on the earth:

**the other gods in whom people delight,**

<sup>4</sup> Though the idols are many that they run after:

**their offerings of blood I will not offer,  
nor take their name upon my lips.**

<sup>5</sup> The Lord is my appointed portion and my cup:

**you hold my lot in your hands.**

<sup>6</sup> The share that has fallen to me is in pleasant places:

**and a fair land is my possession.**

<sup>7</sup> I will bless the Lord who has given me counsel:

**at night also he has instructed my heart.**

<sup>8</sup> I have set the Lord always before me:

**he is at my right hand, and I shall not fall.**

<sup>9</sup> Therefore my heart is glad and my spirit rejoices:

**my flesh also shall rest secure.**

<sup>10</sup> For you will not give me over to the power of death:

**nor suffer your faithful one to see the Pit.**

<sup>11</sup> You will show me the path of life:

**in your presence is the fulness of joy,  
and from your right hand flow delights for evermore.**

## Hebrews 10.11-14, 10.19-25

And every priest stands day after day at his service, offering again and again the same sacrifices that can never take away sins. But when Christ had offered for all time a single sacrifice for sins, 'he sat down at the right hand of God', and since then has been waiting 'until his enemies would be made a footstool for his feet.' For by a single offering he has perfected for all time those who are sanctified. Therefore, my friends, since we have confidence to enter the sanctuary by the blood of Jesus, by the new and living way that he opened for us through the curtain (that is, through his flesh), and since we have a great priest over the house of God, let us approach with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water. Let us hold fast to the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who has promised is faithful. And let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day approaching.

## Mark 13.1-11

As he came out of the temple, one of his disciples said to him, 'Look, Teacher, what large stones and what large buildings!' Then Jesus asked him, 'Do you see these great buildings? Not one stone will be left here upon another; all will be thrown down.' When he was sitting on the Mount of Olives opposite the temple, Peter, James, John, and Andrew asked him privately, 'Tell us, when will this be, and what will be the sign that all these things are about to be accomplished?' Then Jesus began to say to them, 'Beware that no one leads you astray. Many will come in my name and say, "I am he!" and they will lead many astray. When you hear of wars and rumours of wars, do not be alarmed; this must take place, but the end is still to come. For nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom; there will be earthquakes in various places; there will be famines. This is but the beginning of the birth pangs. 'As for yourselves, beware; for they will hand you over to councils; and you will be beaten in synagogues; and you will stand before governors and kings because of me, as a testimony to them. And the good news must first be proclaimed to all nations. When they bring you to trial and hand you over, do not worry beforehand about what you are to say; but say whatever is given you at that time, for it is not you who speak, but the Holy Spirit.
